

- In world politics
- 1. Decolonization
- 2. Difficulty of the West to use its military advantage







World Economy Model Gets Much More Difficult

- Core Changes
- Add: China & Pacific Rim
- Periphery Changes:
- Moves toward Sub-Saharan Africa
- Key Facets of the Theory still stand:
- 1. 2 Countries attempt to set up their own Economic System
- USSR & CHINA
- 2. # of societies (don't become core) but pull out of the periphery
- 3 WAYS
- 1. Import Substitution
 - make it difficult to import standard factory goods. Instead make it themselves
 - o Still import Tech.
 - Reduce reliance on CORE
- 2. Find an advantage your society can exploit
 - Oil, Agric, Industry, Software, etc.
- 3. Only about 20% of the world is Industrialized
 - 40% are industrializing
 - o Terms 1st & 3rd=inaccurate

Population Growth

- 3X from 1914→Present
- 2 BILL-6 BILL
- Huge Fallout
 - ResourcesRate
- Improvements in Public Health
- NOT new medicines
- Increase in Public Health and Food production
- Even with more people being killed in this century than all other centuries combined
 - Population continues to grow


Increase in Technology

OTHER PATTERNS OTHER

MOST SOCIETIES GO THROUGH ONE OR MORE POLITICAL CHANGES SINCE 1914

KEY: EMPIRE & MONARCHY

- Monarchy is essentially gone
 - o Originally this had been around the **MOST!**
- What will the replacement be????
 - o Totalitarian, Authoritarian, Democratic...

CULTURAL CHANGE

- Messy
- Marxism, Western Science, & Consumer Society
- Religious Revival
- CAN' T SPECULATE HOW THIS WILL TURN OUT!
 - MANY CULTURES DIVIDED @ TURN OF 21st CENTURY

GLOBALIZATION

- Red Cross, Canals (Previous Globalization from other periods)
- From WWI → Globalization retreats
- USSR Retreats; Chinese Communists retreat, etc.
- 1970s → Accelerates again
 - Multinational Corporations
 - o Ch & Russ rejoin
 - Huge New Technologies

NEED TO KNOW

- Causes of the WW
 - Cultural and political transformations resulting from the wars
 - Authoritarian Regimes
 - Feminism and Gender relations
 - Growth of international organizations
 - Colonial independence movements
 - The issue of genocide
 - Internationalization of popular culture

SOCIAL UPHEAVAL

- Landed Aristocracy replaced by an upper middle class
 - o L. Arist. Was the dominant class

GENDER

- Less education gap between Men & Women
- Voting rights for both Men & women
 - o Where voting rights exist
- Legal protections (on paper) for women
- Birth Rates Dropping
- As Landed Aristocracy loses influence; women gain more equality

KEY AFRICAN CHANGE

- Change from POLY to MONOtheistic
- 40% Muslim, 40% Christian; 20% Poly
