

WORLD HISTORY TIMELINE PROJECT

Purpose: In World History we are driven by nine major themes. This project forces each student group to focus on these themes and how that particular theme they chose to research was comparable to other regions in the world how that theme changed over time.

Process: In each class students will be divided into 4 person teams and each team will be assigned a specific topic for the chosen theme. Students will have a period of time to research and create a group document that answers each of the following:

1. Events dealing with each theme (P.I.E.M.A.S.T.E.R) on each region of the world
2. Chronology from the beginning of the time period to the end (6-10 events per region)
3. Maps, charts, and images that visually help presentation of topic and help explain it (1 per region)
4. Identification of changes and continuities that exist in your region in regards to your theme
5. Analyses that explain the change, continuity, and comparative nature of each region to another in regards to your assigned theme or themes per region

Evaluation: This is a MAJOR GRADE.

Rubric:

1. Organization, neatness, clarity
2. Two assigned regions; you choose the other region.
3. 12 pieces of evidence, in chronological order, with their appropriate date. 4 pieces from each region. Identify each piece of evidence with the appropriate region.
4. Visual images and identification of theme
 - a. Artwork, architecture, or photograph-
5. Comparison and analysis or contrast and analysis for each theme.
6. Change and analysis or continuity and analysis for a region.

Themes: Political, Intellectual, Social, Technology, Economics, Religion

Layout (25 total slides):

- Slide 1 – Group members and region name
- Slide 2 – 12 pieces of political evidence of your 3 regions
- Slide 3 – Visual
- Slide 4 – Comparison or contrast with analysis
- Slide 5 – Change and continuity with analysis
